A note about the utensil sets on the following pages.

A 1914 Henckels catalog advertises the Slot utensil sets as “Army Knives” and in German: Manöver und Touristenmesser; in French: Couteaux de manoeuvres; in Spanish: Navajas de Campo. Knife collectors sometimes call them “Hobo” or “Slot” knives. The two or three utensils are connected by interlocking slots and tabs on the brass liners. They can be found with ivory, tortoise, horn, wood, silver, and celluloid handles. The worm is attached to either the spoon or the fork. Some worms fold out to the end and others to the middle.




KU03 Slot utensil set with tortoise scales in leather case (snap on case is damaged). Marked WEMMER. \$295




KU07 Slot utensil set with ivory scales. Mark of William Hutton & Sons of Sheffield and London. Hutton closed in 1914. \$225



KU15 Knife and fork/corkscrew set. The knife is marked J. J. MECCHI, 112 REGENT ST. (London). 1851 hallmark with Robert Hutton's (Sheffield) maker's mark. See next page for details on the armorial crest. There are two hairline cracks on the fork scale. \$479



The armorial crest on the preceding page belonged to William Stuart (1798 -1874)

William Stuart, of Tempsford Hall in Bedfordshire and Aldenham Abbey in Hertfordshire, was the eldest son of William Stuart, Archbishop of Armagh, and Sophia Margaret Juliana, daughter of Thomas Penn of Stoke Poges. The Archbishop was the fourth son of John, 3rd Earl of Bute. He was Justice of the Peace and a Deputy Lieutenant. He married, firstly, 8 August 1821, Henrietta Maria Sarah, eldest daughter of Admiral Sir Charles Morice Pole, Baronet. She died 26 July 1853, and he married, secondly, 31 August 1854, Georgina Adelaide Forester. He collected a large library part of which was sold at Sotheby, Wilkinson & Hodge 17 June 1875, and a further portion at Christie, Manson & Wood's on 6 March 1895 when 215 lots realised £4,296.19.0. The remainder of the library was destroyed by fire at Tempsford Hall not long after the sale. The Royal Library at Windsor has a large number of books that belonged to Lord Stuart de Rothesay and to William Stuart. The latter bought many books at the sale of the former and often added his arms to books that had belonged to him, but were without his arms.




KU17 Three piece utensil set marked ED. WÜSTHOF SOLINGEN. There is a hairline crack on the fork scale. \$79



CL56 Corkscrew with nesting cups and bottle stopper/pourer in leather case. One side of the tag is marked DEPOSE and the other as shown. The worm fits in the handle as shown at top left. \$45



CL60 Cylinder case marked CROSS. The cup is the top and inside is a leather pouch holding a utensil set. Marked CROSS. \$125
