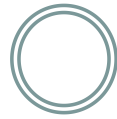

The father of the lazy tongs corkscrew was Marshall Wier. An abridged version of his patent specification reads "The screw is attached to a centre pin of the lowest pair of cross-bars of the lazy-tongs, and the ring, which passes over the bottle neck, is hinged to the side bars, suitable stops being provided to prevent lateral motion when the corkscrew is closed. A suitable handle is hinged at the other end of the lazy-tongs."



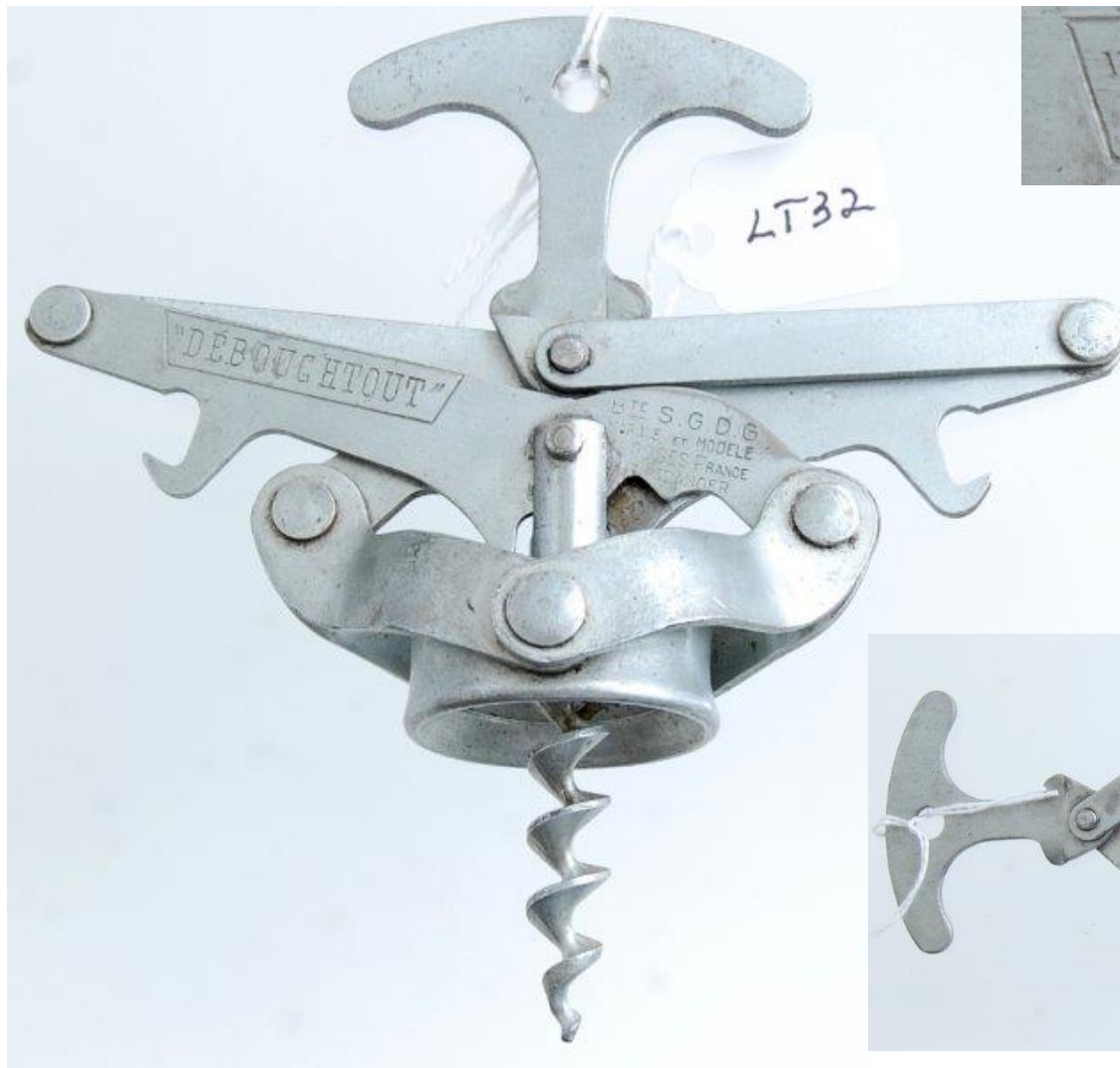
LT21 A ceramic lazytongs/concertina corkscrews. 8.5" long with two .75" deep resting places for pulled corks or whatever. \$295

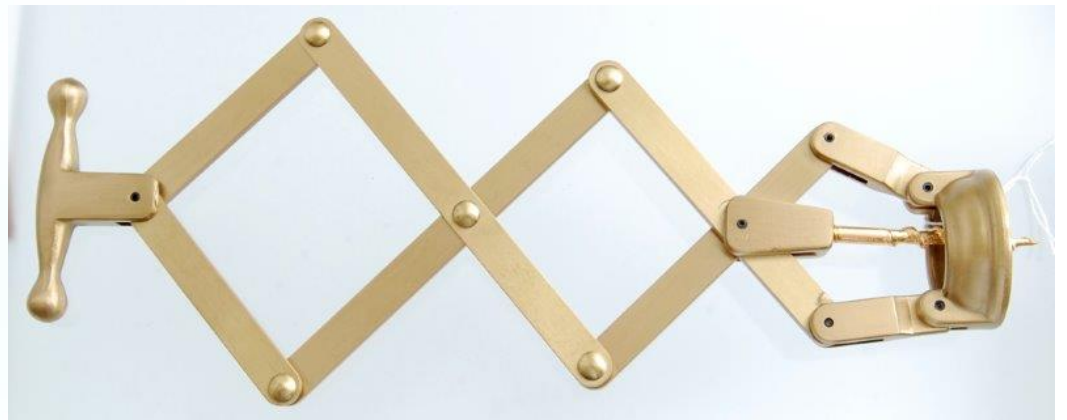
LT32 Debourchtout in aluminum. Marked as shown. \$65
